

ANNOUNCEMENT OF WINNERS

for the IAEA 2016 International Essay Competition on Nuclear Security for Students and Early Career Professionals

Background

The IAEA invited students and early career professionals, aged 35 years and under, to submit an innovative and original essay on the future of Nuclear Security: Commitments and Actions. To inspire essay topics, applicants were referred to the Conference Webpage for a list of high-level themes and technical session subjects to be discussed at the 2016 International Conference on Nuclear Security: Commitments and Actions.

Winners

The Essay Competition gathered a high level of interest and resulted in 353 essays submissions by the deadline of 5 September 2016.
