Objectives

The major objective of the conference is to provide a forum for participants to exchange experience, and to review the actions implemented to improve the radiation safety in radiotherapy both at national and international level. The expectations from this conference are:

- to reach a consensus about activities to strengthen existing international actions for prevention of incidents and accidents;
- to set up an international cooperation to improve management for overexposed patients;
- to outline a strategy for strengthening regulation;
- to contribute to the elaboration of an international scale to rate patient related events for communication and reporting purpose.

Audience

The conference will be of interest to private individuals and organizations involved in the field of safety in radiotherapy, in particular: health and safety authorities, health professionals, patient associations and medical device manufacturers.
